The Who, What, Where of the Emergency Preparedness Requirements for Medicare & Medicaid Providers

Last September, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid issued the final rule establishing national emergency preparedness requirements for 17 provider types, including all homecare, hospice and PACE/LIFE programs participating in Medicare and Medicaid - making it a historical first-ever national emergency preparedness requirement. This regulation, which requires providers to plan adequately for natural and man-made disasters with a specific focus on patients and employees is comprehensive, has a significant cost and is time intensive.
