S. 445/H.R. 1825	The Home Health Care Planning Improvement Act of 2017 would allow nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified nurse-midwives, and physician assistants to order home health services under Medicare. H.R. 2663	The Home Health Documentation and Program Improvement Act of 2017 eases the physician documentation requirement by merely requiring demonstration that a timely encounter occurred and narrow the circumstances where a face-to-face encounter is required by excluding patients transferred from a hospital or SNF. The bill also addresses CMS's past claim denials by requiring CMS to either reach a settlement with affected home health agencies or reopen and pay those claims denied related to the physician narrative.
